



## How this relate with analysis and planning

- Systematic protection analysis is foundational to the Protection Cluster response.
- We need some harmonization of actions respecting country specificity to engage AoR and partners.
- Organize 4/5W to provide information on contribution to the reduction of protection risks and HNO/HRP indicators.
- 4/5W can be used more strategically in analysis and planning sessions





## **Core messages**

- ✓ **Protection risks severity and prioritization** inform the HPC process.
- It is critical to start mapping the activities in the 5W and we will be doing it progressively
- We need to harmonize more to ensure predictability and quicker inductions of new PC staff and partners in new contexts.
- ✓ IMOs and coordinator to increase joint engagement on strategic planning to anticipate specific HNO and HRP processes.
