

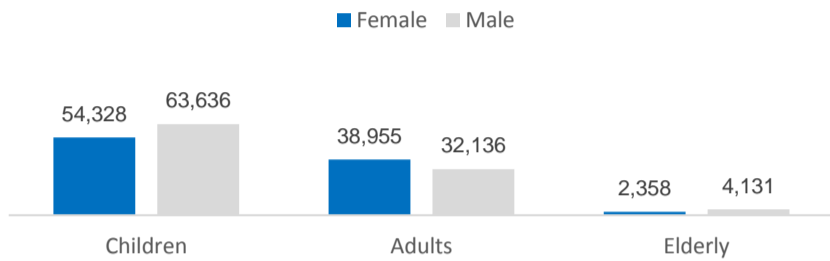
UNHCR in collaboration with Nigeria Immigration Service (NIS), State Emergency Management Agency (SEMA), and National Emergency Management Agency NEMA carry out registration at the border control points in the north east where initial immigration and security screening of the returnees is conducted. **195,544** Nigerians have returned back to Nigeria. **121,199** registered from Cameroon, **74,094** from Niger and **251** from Chad. **82%** of the returnees were unregistered, **74%** have destroyed properties, and **72%** not provided with food and water during their journey back to Nigeria.

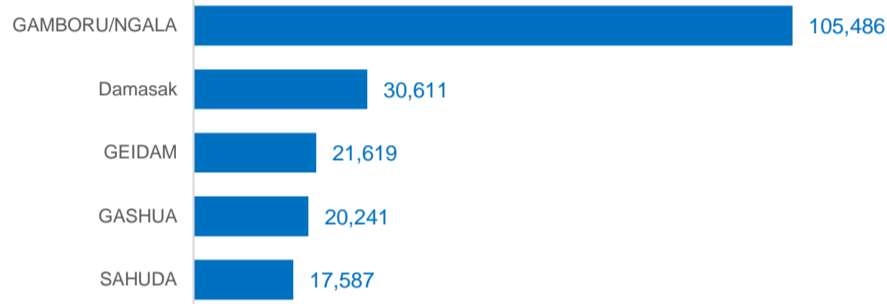

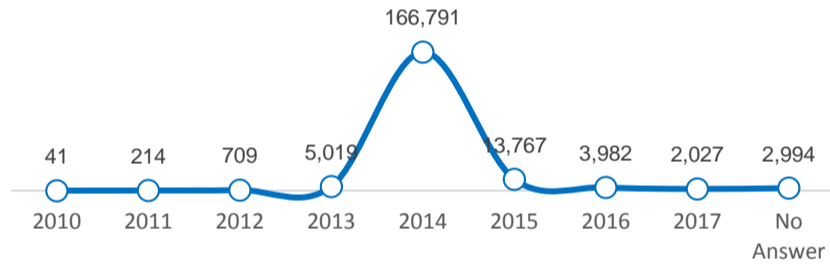

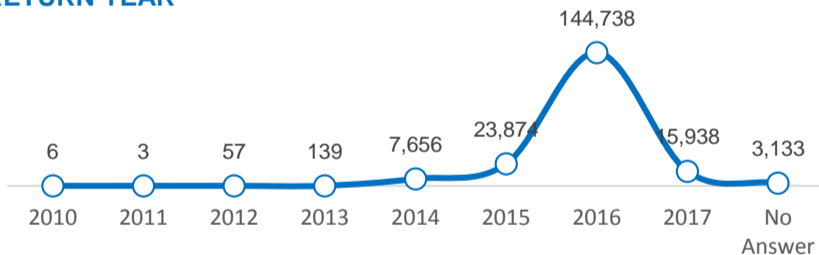
REGISTRATION PLACE



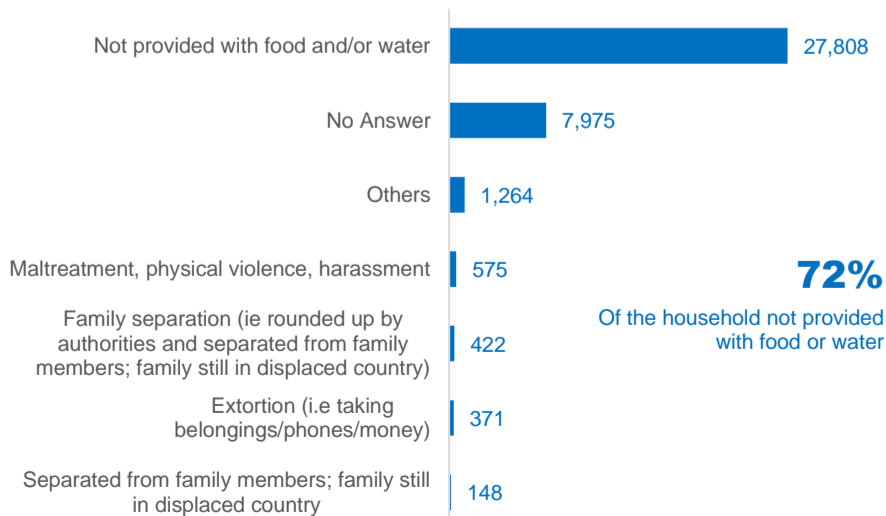
DISPLACEMENT YEAR



RETURN YEAR

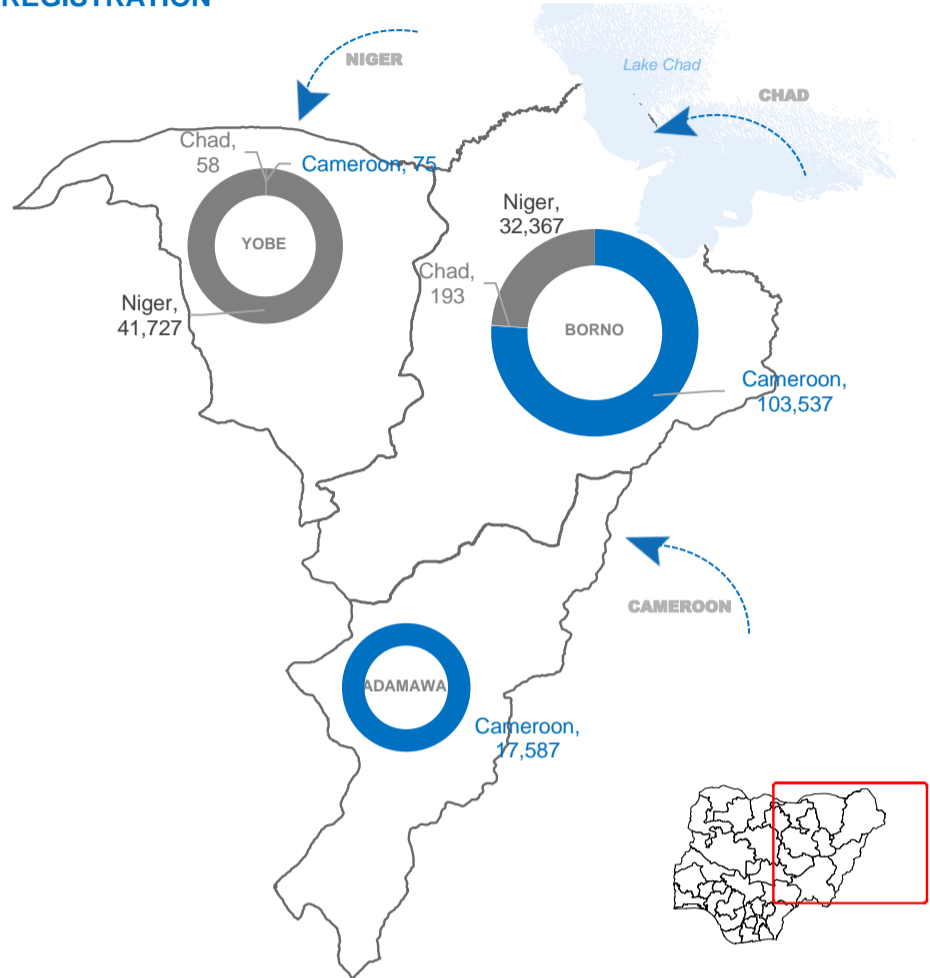


CONDITIONS DURING RETURN (HH)

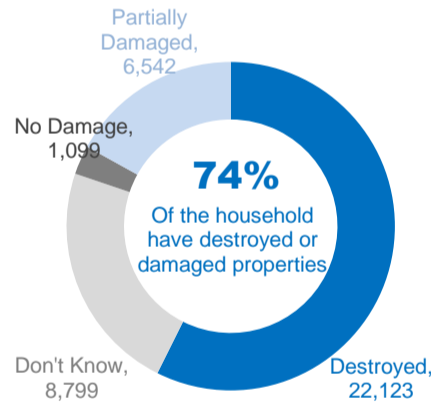

OVERVIEW BY STATE OF REGISTRATION

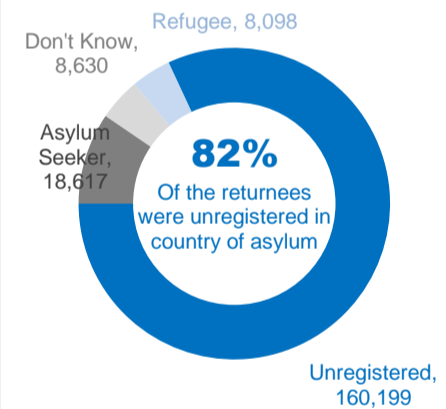


PROPERTY STATUS (HH)



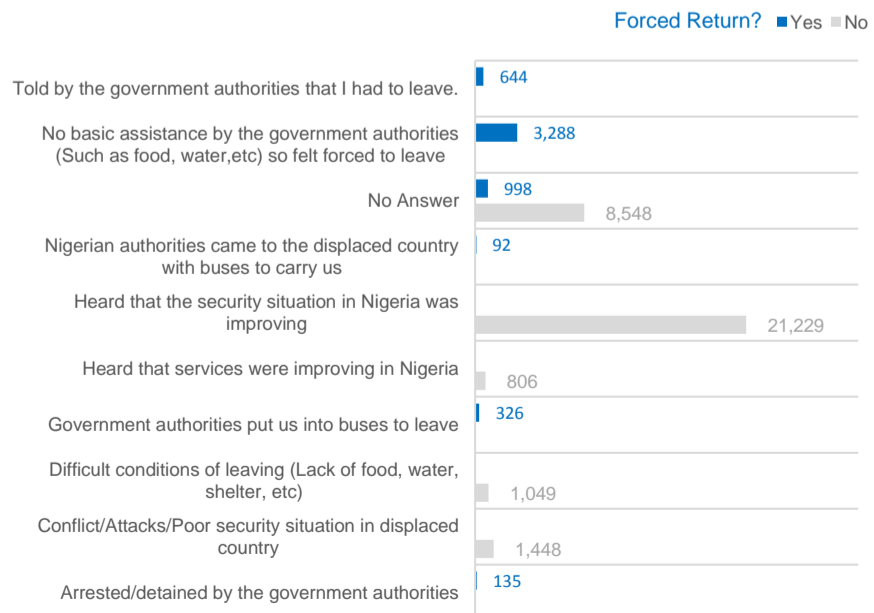
