<p>Updates on the schedule of coordination meetings at district level</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • DPGCAS updated the PC members about the coordination meetings which will take place in Buzi, Dondo and Nhamatanda Districts. • DPGCAS and UNHCR mentioned that the coordination meetings will begin on 29 October in Buzi district, since the elections are over. • DPGCAS and UNHCR further reported that they will also visit Dondo District on Wednesday, 6 November 2019 and on Wednesday 13 November they will visit Nhamatanda district. • DPGCAS and UNHCR mentioned that, in Buzi district, district coordination meetings will be held every Tuesday and, in Dondo and Nhamatanda, every Wednesday. • DPGCAS asked the PC members if they have any comments about the coordination meetings. • CCCM asked DPGCAS and UNHCR to confirm the time of the meetings in Buzi, Nhamatanda and Dondo. • UNHCR mentioned that they will confirm the time through email, but usually the meetings start at 10:30am. 	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. <p>Protection Gaps identified by the CCCM Cluster</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • UNHCR shared with PC members a list of protection challenges identified by the CCCM Cluster. UNHCR highlighted the protection challenges once again. • UNHCR asked if the PC members managed to assist in filling in some of the gaps indicated. • UNFPA mentioned that they are not working in Begaja. • Plan International reported that they are running three WFS in Buzi – Inhangau, Inhanju and Bandua- and they are using the DPGCAS WFS in Bandua. • Plan International further reported that, with the help of the community leaders they looked at areas which need more help and they agreed that in Estaquinha they do not need a CFS. • IOM is planning to build 2 protection desks in Buzi. • Plan International asked IOM about the places where they will build the tents. • IOM mentioned that, they will update the PC members about the locations next week. • Plan International mentioned that they are not going to have CFSs in Buzi, they will give the responsibilities to child protection committees. • DPGCAS asked Plan International if they are not going to focus on CFSs since they will give the responsibilities to the child protection committees. • Plan international responded that, the main idea is for them to turn the CFSs in to Early childhood centers. • DPGCAS mentioned that, since they will be visiting Buzi next week they will gather more information about the issue. • CCCM Buzi reported that in Inhamizwe there is a protection desk. • UNFPA mentioned that in Begaja there is a CFS, but they don't have a WFS. • CCCM Buzi reported that in Begaja there is no children friendly space and the women friendly space paralyzed the activities • UNHCR asked CCCM Buzi to clarify the protection challenges in Buzi because they were not clear. • CCCM Buzi agreed to clarify during the next meeting. 	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • UNFPA mentioned that they are in a process of finalizing their partnership with Plan International. • UNFPA further reported that they are not going to build WFS, but they will find mechanism of working with women in the sites. • In addition to that UNFPA mentioned that they will be working in 15 WFS which are available in the sites. • UNHCR asked UNFPA to keep updating the PC members about their progress. 	
<p>Updates from the Child Protection and GBV Sub-clusters and Disability Working Group</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • UNFPA mentioned that, due to elections they did not manage to have many activities in the sites. • UNFPA further reported that as from 28 October 2019 they will be distributing dignity kits in the resettlement sites. • In addition to that they further reported that two UNFPA trucks with tents are stuck in Maputo so they will not be able to have the tents on time. • On 23 October 2019, UNFPA will have a meeting at Ponta Gea with the Ministry of Gender and PC members who are willing to join the meeting are invited. • The main reason for the meeting will be: planning of 16 Days of Activism. • FAMOD asked UNFPA to confirm the time of the meeting because they want to participate. • UNFPA mentioned that the meeting will start at 8:00am at Ponta Gea, at Ministry of Gender Department. • UNFPA asked DPGCAS to share information about the activities. • DPGCAS mentioned that all members are invited at Ponta Gea on the 23 of October. • DPGCAS further reported that they will send the theme of the event to all PC members as soon as possible. • UNICEF mentioned that the case management workshop is rescheduled for 30 to 31 October. • UNICEF further reported that the next CP Sub-cluster meeting will take place on 22 October 2019 and they will announce the venue. • FAMOD invited organizations that are interested in planning for International day for Persons with disabilities. The ceremony will be observed in Beira. The meeting will be held on 23 October 2019 at Centro Transito Macurungo at 8:00am. 	

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • DPGCAS mentioned that they were not aware of the meeting so they will contact the Ministry, but partners are invited. • UNFPA suggested that it is advisable for all partners to have a calendar, work and plan together as a team. All activities which falls between 25 November-10 December must be planned together. • DPGCAS agreed with UNFPA's idea of team work and they announced the events which will take place as follows:16 days of Activism, World AIDS DAY: 1 December 2019, Human Rights Day:10 December 2019 and International Day of Persons with disabilities:3 December 2019. • Light For the world reported that they are working with 18 final year students who are doing their internship on social sciences. • Light for the World distributed food items to 2536 families in Buzi and they will distribute 32-wheel chairs to children with disabilities. • Light for the World mentioned that they are concerned about the issue of latrines in Buzi. • UNFPA mentioned that they are willing to train Light for the World on GBV issues. • DPGCAS mentioned that they are concerned about organizations who are not reporting to them because they do not understand their roles in Beira. • UNICEF mentioned that they are also concerned, they feel it is the Ministries duty to mention about other organizations who are already available to the new organizations so that, old and new organations will work together to avoid duplicating resources. • DPGCAS mentioned that they are concerned, because some of the new organizations mentioned that, they are receiving funds from some organizations who were in the meeting. • DPGCAS further reported that all organizations should report to them so that they can understand more about their work. 	
<p>Update from the organizations on their protection activities</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • UNHCR mentioned that, they will share the 3 Protection Monitoring Overviews for Savane, Mandruzi and Cura resettlement sites, jointly conducted in the framework of UNHCR's partnership with Kulima. • UNHCR asked the PC members if they were also doing protection monitoring, because it helps to identify some challenges faced by community members, plan for various activities and it prevents organizations from duplicating activities. If so, UNHCR asked them to share results with the PC. 	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. UNHCR to share three protection monitoring overviews. 2. Light for the world will share their document later because they are still working on it.

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Light for the world mentioned that they have a draft of their protection monitoring report. • UNICEF mentioned that they are trying to work on Child Protection analysis. • UNHCR asked UNFPA if they are doing Protection monitoring. • UNFPA reported that, they will ask their colleague who oversees that area and update the PC members. 	
AOB	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • UNHCR had a meeting with DTM to follow-up on the questions submitted by the PC. As DTM is not collecting data at a family level, the questions suggested by the PC were not included in DTM's survey. DTM and the PC are exploring other ways of collaboration. • DPGCAS and UNHCR will share the calendar of the District Coordination meetings and the contacts of the respective authorities assigned to lead them.
