Community Mobilizer Mapping Exercise	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> As requested by DPGCAS, the discussion regarding the mapping of community mobilizers involving the district authorities is postponed to the next meeting, Aug 15, as Mr. Diquissone (PC co-coordinator) and Buzi's district authority were unable to attend today's meeting. 	
5W	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> UNHCR explained how the KoBo questionnaire should be filled and informed that so far only two organizations have shared their activities, CUAMM and Handicap Internacional; UNICEF stressed that they also have a 5W. Hence, to avoid duplication, UNHCR and UNICEF will work together to harmonize the indicators. UNHCR emphasizes it is crucial that the organizations coordinate with their implementing partners to avoid duplication of activities and information reported. 	Organizations should send their activities by August 13 at the latest.
Security Incidents in the resettlement sites	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> UNHCR – thefts have been increasingly reported over the last days in different resettlement sites. Hence, on August 7, WFP, UNHCR, UNICEF, UNFPA, PRM and INGC have met to develop an inter-agency referral pathway on the incidents reported through <i>Linha Verde</i>. Next meeting will take place on August 14 at 14:00 at UNHCR's office. 	<p>Information for the mapping exercise to be sent by August 13th</p> <p>Oxfam, IOM and WFP to confirm on what they will be able to report by August 8 COB.</p>

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • In this context, UNHCR introduces a mapping exercise of protection incidents aimed at addressing the issues with the appropriate response mechanisms, including governmental counterparts. It has been agreed that: <ol style="list-style-type: none"> I. UNICEF will report on child domestic violence, child exploitation, child neglect, early marriage and any other incident related to Child Protection; II. IOM will report on domestic violence and thefts; III. UNHCR will report on the presence of PRM and/or polícia comunitária in resettlement sites. IV. Oxfam will liaise with CARE (PSEA Network co-chair) to confirm they will be able to report on SEA incidents; V. IOM will liaise with the CCCM Cluster Coordinator to enquire about the possibility to report on unauthorized plot sale and evictions; VI. WFP will liaise with their colleagues to confirm they will be able to report on incidents of fraud and corruption. 	
Mission to Chibabava	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • UNICEF, UNHCR and Plan International had a joint mission to Chibabava on August 5 and 6. <ol style="list-style-type: none"> I. Several protection issues have been identified, including II. early marriages, III. lack of medical facilities and police force, IV. the nearest school is located 12km away from the resettlement site, V. large number of undocumented people, among others. • A thorough report will be shared in due course. • UNICEF has requested ICCG to include Chibabava into the HRP. As a result, HRP was reopened for a day to allow the submission of projects targeting that area. 	
Identification of people with Specific Needs – Dashboard on Mandruzi	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • UNHCR, alongside its partner Kulima, has just finalized and shared the report on the identification of people with specific needs in Mandruzi. 	
Other Issues	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • IOM follows up on the issue of the tents in Savane, as last week strong wind blows destroyed women friendly spaces. • CCCM would be able to assist in setting up new tents. 	IOM will contact UNFPA to discuss it.
